



















Map Legend and Rules

Overlook Trail

About 0.6 miles
Blazed with blue circles



The paved section of Overlook Trail takes you past ponds to the Blue Heron Overlook. Continue to the forest. You may see herons, eagles, deer, ducks, shorebirds, turtles, frogs, and muskrats.

Spatterdock Trail

About 1 mile
Blazed with orange squares



Spatterdock Trail makes a loop along ponds, through both hemlock and hardwood forests, and near the Hugh Wood Tower. You may see eagles, ducks, and muskrats. Songbirds abound in spring.

Backwoods Trail

About 1 mile
Blazed with pink stars



The wilder Backwoods Trail begins at a narrow bridge. Take this trail out to a loop through forests and wetlands before returning to the starting point.

Big Pond Trail

About 2 miles
Blazed with yellow triangles



Big Pond Trail takes you through fields, forests, and wetlands. Travel from the shade of the hemlocks to the openness of Bluebird Field. This trail is a sample of all the various habitats of Audubon.

Trails and programs are supported by members. You get a discount in the store and on programs, among other benefits. If you love to visit, your membership helps support the place you love.

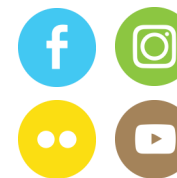
